The following is intended to be a basic resource for veterans entering college. It is not designed to be comprehensive and does not cover all benefits. - Montgomery GI Bill/Post 9/11 GI Bill
 - Visit the Certifying Official on campus to apply.
 - Once you begin receiving your benefit checks, you need to verify attendance every month: <https://www.gibill.va.gov/wave/default.cfm>
 - Keep Certifying Official informed of any changes in your status.
- Army Federal Tuition Assistance
 - Apply early, money for this program runs out!
 - Army National Guard members apply at: <http://www.virtualarmory.com>
 - Army Reserve members apply at: <https://www.armyreserveeducation.com>
- Minnesota National Guard – State Tuition Reimbursement
 - Complete required paperwork with unit education officer.
 - A funding request must be submitted annually.
 - Request payment once grades have been received
- Minnesota GI Bill
 - \$1,000 per term/\$2,000 per year/\$10,000 lifetime
 - “Last dollar in” program
 - Apply thru campus financial aid office
 - Must submit FAFSA

- Many services for veterans are available on campus
 - Veterans Upward Bound (H.2400)– information regarding benefits and resources
 - Veterans Certification – processing and assistance with MGIB benefits
 - Student Organizations – many campuses have veterans clubs
 - Counseling – personal and career counseling
- Disability Services (I.2400) – provides accommodations for students for disabilities
- Financial Aid (Student Services Center T.2200) – Information and assistance regarding loans and grants
